Interested in learning about the U.S. Department of Energy's *energy management services for manufacturers*?

In this session, we'll hear from DoE program managers as they discuss their 50,001 Ready, Industrial Assessment Center (IAC), and Combined Heat and Power (CHP) programs:

- 50,001 Ready - This program is a self-paced, no-cost way for organizations to build a culture of structured energy improvement that leads to deeper and sustained savings that does not require any external audits or certifications.
- IAC - Small and medium-sized manufacturers may be eligible to receive a no-cost assessment provided by DOE IACs. Teams located at 31 universities around the country conduct energy assessments to identify opportunities to improve productivity and competitiveness, reduce waste, and save energy.
- CHP - The goal of the CHP R&D project portfolio is to enable private sector development of flexible CHP systems that can play a potential role in stabilizing and improving the resiliency of the electric grid.
